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WATERCOLOR QUILT WORKSHOP

In this workshop the attendees will learn about color theory and how to use color to create two blocks with my "Watercolor" technique using fabrics. The participants will cut and sew fabrics and compose with these pieces in the design wall, to create a final composition that they will be able to sew all together.


Materials Needed

- · Masking tape
- Pencil
- Pins
- · Rotary cutter
- · Quarter inch foot
- · Thread for sewing
- 8 fat quarters (solids) in 8 different colors that create a transition from one color to another (for example from purple to red) SEE EXAMPLE 1
- OR
- 8 fat quarters that are in the same color going from a lighter shade to a darker shade. SEE EXAMPLE 2
- · Sewing machine
- · Iron and ironing table
- · Notebook and pencil for taking notes

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COLOR VALUE:

Value is the relative degree of lightness or darkness of a color (lighter or darker).

Here you have an example of 7 values in blue, from light to dark.

As we are working with fabrics, it is impossible to find the perfect transition or perfect different values, don't worry if you don't find the perfect colors use what you have, you will see that your transition will work perfect!
